Barter Theatre – History of this Unique Theatre & New Musical Coming Soon

ABINGDON, Va. April 26, 2017 – Many know the Barter Theatre as a location to view amazing performances in an eclectic town. But not many know the history and story of how the theater began.

During the Great Depression, money was scarce. Robert Porterfield, a young actor from southwest Virginia, suggested a great idea, he recommended that bartering produce from farms and gardens in the area to serve as a ticket to view a play.

On June 10, 1933, the Barter Theatre opened, and the produce bartering system was extremely popular. Admission price was 40 cents or what monetary value in produce. Four out of five

theater attendees during the Great Depression paid their admission in produce. The concept of bartering for admission to a play caught on quickly and the theater seats were constantly filled. The Barter Theatre pays homage to their unique history until this day by accepting food bank donations as the expense of admission for at least one performance each year.

The Barter Theatre is located in beautiful downtown Abingdon, VA. where it features two stages for shows. The Gilliam Stage is a traditional style of theater, with orchestra and balcony seating for 506 audience members. The Barter Stage II is located across the street from the Gilliam Stage and provides a closer viewing experience for theater patrons. The Barter Stage II features stadium-style seating with the stage on ground level which provides a distinctive viewing experience.

Among the many plays the Barter Theatre produces each year, "Footloose: The Musical" is sure to draw a crowd. This long-time film favorite will now be featured as a play where patrons can experience the movie in real life. This classic story opens on May 19 at 8 p.m. and will have over 50 showings throughout the summer until the last showing on August 12 at 8 p.m. "Footloose: The Musical" will appeal to theater patrons because the success and unparalleled popularity of the original film will translate over into the musical performance version. This musical showcases numerous Billboard chart topping songs that have become classics throughout the years.

The Barter Theatre is dedicated to furthering the education of young minds. - The Barter Theatre opened in 1933 and offered patrons the opportunity to pay for admission to a play with produce and livestock.
- The town jail was located directly beneath the stage but was later converted into actor's dressing rooms.
- The Barter Theatre building was also used as offices and a fire hall.
- "Footloose: The Musical" will feature numerous billboard chart topping songs.
- In 1948 the Barter Theatre won the Antoinette Perry "Tony" Award for Regional Theatre
- In 1946 the Barter Theatre is chosen as the State Theatre of Virginia; it was the first professional theater to have this status.
